The Majority View vs. The Minority View of the Christian World

The Infernialists

- 99% of souls that have ever lived, are living or will ever live will go to Hell and the Lake of Fire to be punished and tortured for eternity for temporal sins.
- 2. The result of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the Cross results in only partial redemption.
- 3. This doctrine of men minimizes the Love of God for His creation and drives millions from Jesus Christ.

The Universalist

- 1. Confirms the Sacrifice of Jesus Christ provides ultimate redemption for all of God's creation.
- 1. Draws mankind to God by His Love rather than fear of eternal torture.
- 2. Does not deny the reality of Hell and the Lake of Fire, but confirms just punishment for sinners and correction.
- 3. Total expiation of all sin in the fullness of times.

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We can argue the Hebrew and Greek definitions for the words translated as "For ever and ever", ever lasting, eternity etc. but the scriptures listed above are extremely clear that the sacrifice of Jesus Christ provides the complete redemption of all things. The doctrine of infernalism is a gross contraction of scripture. Just because it has been the majority view since the middle ages does not make it correct. In fact it is not even common sense.
